Imran to blow the whistle on Benazir Bhutto

Says he will make public corruption by former PM before Oct 18

LAHORE: Pakistan Tehreek-e-Insaf Chief Imran Khan has announced that he will make public Pakistan People's Party (PPP) chairperson Benazir Bhutto's corruption scandals before October 18 with documentary proof.

Imran made this announcement while addressing a press conference at his residence Wednesday. He alleged that Benazir was the main person who played a devious role in sabotaging the efforts of the Opposition for the restoration of real democracy. He said that whenever the opposition parties tried to form a grand alliance, Benazir got it postponed by employing delaying tactics.

He said that Benazir did not believe in democracy and people's rights, as her only interest was to secure her ill-gotten money, which she and her spouse got through kickbacks. He said that the PPP chairperson

had ignored the message of the PPP's founding chairman by supporting dictatorial forces in the country.

Imran said that Benazir had been giving statements that projected her impression as a 'spokeswoman' for the US State Department. He said that President General Musharraf, just to prolong his illegitimate regime, was bringing in an indemnity ordinance that would give amnesty to the politicians and bureaucrats in cases against them from 1988 to 1999, adding that he was doing so only to benefit the PPP. He said that the corruption cases could only be decided through courts and these cases should be sent to the courts under a civilian government, adding that only the courts could give a clean-chit to any party or individual.

He said that the incumbent military regime had established National Accountability Bureau (NAB) by utilising the tax-payers' money to bring to justice the looters of the public exchequer but as soon as President Musharraf started talks with the PPP, the Special Operations Division was rolled back without keeping in mind that the PPP chairperson's Rs 100 billion corruption scandals were published in the national press and flashed on the electronic media. About his campaign against Muttahida Quomi Movement (MQM) chief Altaf Hussain, he said the government had given no response to the Scotland Yard counter terrorism division's request to question witnesses in Pakistan.

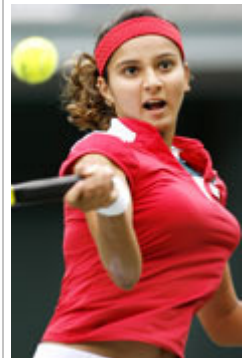
He said that he would continue with his struggle for the restoration of democracy and rule of law.
